Over the Pastor's Shoulder

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, to the close of the age"

(Matthew 28:19, 20)

My parents carried me to the baptismal font as an infant. Two other sets of parents each carried a son to the font that same day. The boys' names were Peter and John. Prior to the three baptisms that morning, the pastor said: "What an honor. How many pastors can say, 'I baptized Peter, James and John?'"

A story both cute and true. But now almost 60 years later, what difference does it make that I was baptized? What difference does it make that one Sunday morning you too were baptized?

I find it interesting that the great protestant reformer Martin Luther would often remember his baptism. Whenever Luther felt himself sinking into despair (be it over struggles in his own personal life or conflict in the church) he found it helpful to touch his forehead whereon the sign of the cross had been made at his baptism, and to say Baptismatus sum ("I am baptized").

Perhaps we 21st century Christians ought to take our cue from the 16th century reformer and whenever we encounter differences and divisions in the church, we ought to touch our foreheads and repeat the words, "I have been baptized". That means because there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism" we have the gift of unity. We are all in this together.

In the church, in honestly addressing the scourge of racism, remember, "I have been baptized". We are no longer bound by the traditional category of insiders and outsiders. The old, painful external distinctions made between people have been washed away in the waters of baptism.

In struggling with injustices committed against women down through the ages and still today, remember, "I have been baptized", which means, according to Galatians 3, "there is neither male nor female in Christ". Gender is not the fundamental identity of Christians.

When living in a world where people are often judged by the clothes they wear, the make of the car they drive, the size and location of their house, "I've been baptized", which means that deep distinctions between rich and poor, haves and have nots, have been rearranged, turned upside in Christ so that we come to see those of us who are rich in things as often poor in spirit. And those who are poor in things as rich in spirit.

And when I find myself face-to-face with the inevitable vicissitudes of life, like Luther, I say to myself, "I am baptized!" That means because I am a child of God there is nothing, absolutely nothing, this world can serve up that will separate me from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

I've been baptized. That makes all the difference. And together those of us who have been baptized are called to make a difference in the world for Christ's sake.

Looking ahead to the fall you should know that Trinity is committed to intergenerational worship. Children will be present in our worship every week. The Nursery Room will be available for infants and toddlers. For parents that are unsure if their 4 – 7 year olds are ready on any given Sunday for worship – childcare will also be offered. The rest of the children will be encouraged to participate in worship with their families. Yes, junior high and high schoolers are more than welcomed to worship together in the balcony.

Trinity is also committed to Christian Formation for all ages. Sunday School classes will begin on September 13 at 11:15 A.M. We currently have two adult options. We are hoping to add a third. Sunday School class for the children will be divided as follows:

Preschool & Kindergarten 1st - 3rd grade 4th - 6th grade Confirmation (7th – 8th grade) High School (9th-12th grade)

A brief word about Sunday morning procedure: Just before the Sunday morning offering, the children will be invited to the front of the sanctuary to receive a blessing from the Pastor. The children will then be lead by Linda Kozak into Peterson Hall for a time of singing. At approximately 11:10 A.M., Sunday School teachers will meet their students in Peterson Hall and escort them to the classroom. Sunday School will end for all ages at 12 noon. Teachers are to remain in the class with the students until the children are picked up by their parents.

Our class in the Fireside Room will begin on September

13 at 11:15 A.M. after the morning worship service. Our teacher will be Jenny DeVivo, Assistant Professor of Theology at Lewis University in Romeoville. Her subject will be "The Gospel According to Luke". Please join us for this inspirational experience.

Rich Hood will be leading a class on Jesus' Sermon on the Mount in the Overflow Room starting on September 13. New Testament Scholar William Barkley was correct in explaining:

"The Sermon on the Mount is not one sermon of Jesus, given at one particular time and on one particular occasion; it is the essence of all that Jesus continuously and habitually taught his disciples." As present-day disciples, the Sermon on the Mount offers invaluable direction as we follow Jesus day in and day out. You will find Rich's class both helpful and informative.

Dear Friends In Christ,

I am reaching out today to ask each of you to prayerfully consider giving of your time and yourself to help us with our Kingdom Kids Sunday School Programs this year. A few weeks ago Pastor Jim preached about the importance of teaching our children in the faith. We have done a good job in the past but I believe we can do better.

With our new schedule at Trinity no one will have to skip the worship service to teach Sunday School. I am very excited about this change seeing it as an opportunity. My prayer is that we will have volunteers who will be willing to teach a class for a month or even better, a quarter...three months..at a time. This would bring some consistency to the classes for our children. I believe this will raise the expectations of their learning. If they see us making the effort to be sure they understand and retain their lessons, I think they will rise to meet these expectations.

I would ask any volunteers to be willing to take the teacher's guide home and spend some time preparing for each class. The children will attend the Worship Service at 10:00 am with the rest of the congregation. They will be invited to the front of the Sanctuary for a Blessing just before the Time of Offering. They will then proceed to Peterson Hall where they will have their own Worship songs with Linda Kozak each Sunday. You would be expected to meet the children in Peterson Hall and then proceed to the classrooms for Sunday School. Sunday School will end at 12:00. Teachers will be asked to keep children in classrooms and be ready to release them to their parents at this time.

There are three classes, (Preschool and Kindergarten), (1st -3rd), and finally (4th-6th.) I will also be looking for volunteers to provide Child Care for preschool students and others who may not be ready, on any certain Sunday, to join us in the Sanctuary for 10:00 am Worship.

Please think about your own journey. Was there anyone who made a lasting impact on your Faith? Was it perhaps a Sunday School teacher? Considering this, do you have something to offer our children today? They won't get there on their own. They need us. They need sound instruction. Co-chairs will be notified 2 weeks prior to the event that the committee will be serving. It will be the co-chairs' responsibility to contact the other members of your committee. You also will be responsible for letting the church custodian know of your set-up needs.

Each committee has been assigned to serve at one and no more than two events over the course of a calendar year. Thank you in advance for serving.

The events currently on the church calendar include (but are not limited to):

Sunday School Kick Off (September)

Advent Dinner (December)

VBS Finale (July)

Checklist for Serving Committee

- 1. Someone must have a church key to open and close church.
- 2. If Corelle dishes are used, turn on dishwasher 45 minutes ahead of time. See directions by dishwasher. (Pull down cover and push "On" button).
- 3. Scrape off food into garbage cans NOT disposal.
- 4. Place dishes in soapy water soak pans before going into dishwasher.
- 5. One person on each committee should be familiar with dishwasher and know how to use it.
- 6. Screens in sinks are to be used at ALL TIMES to prevent food particles from getting into sewer lines. (Sewer backups have been caused by this!)
- 7. Assign someone on committee to make sure:
 - a. Dishwasher is turned "OFF". Lever in back must be pulled up to drain water.
 - b. All ovens and burners are off.
 - c. All refrigerator and freezer doors are closed.
 - d. All church lights and fans are off, i.e. Bathroom lights. (Some hall lights remain on at all times.)
 - e. All church doors are locked.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to Noah's Ark Preschool. Mrs. Wojcik and I are looking forward to teaching your child this year. We have many fun and exciting activities planned to help your child develop skills needed for Kindergarten. Implementing the A Beka curriculum will help achieve each child's educational goal. The curriculum is well rounded and incorporates many hands on activities that will encourage learning. We are looking forward to this school year!

During the first few weeks, the children will begin to learn and recognize vowels. This is achieved through learning and singing the vowel song. Building the skills of letter sound awareness throughout the year will help your child begin to develop pre-reading skills.

The curriculum focuses on the following key areas.

Skills development: Helps encourage the children to work on their fine motor skills and writing skills.

Phonics and Reading: Helps each child build their phonological skills by mastering the sounds and recognition of letters.

Handwriting: The children will work on the proper pencil grip and learn that letters live in a house, just like they do! The children will work on the proper steps taken to print the uppercase and lowercase alphabet letters.

Numbers: The children will work on counting 1-100 and will be able to recognize numbers 0-20+.

Story and Poetry Time: Encourages children to enhance their language and comprehension skills.

Arts and Crafts: Helps children express their creativity.

Centers: Gives the children an opportunity to explore the classroom while rotating centers.

This month we will start learning our basic shapes and colors red, yellow, blue and green, letters Aa-Bb, and numbers 1-2.


Encourage your child everyday by asking them about their day at school and having them hang special papers in a place of honor. Please be sure to praise your child for all the efforts they have shown!
