## Over the Pastor's Shoulder

I invite you to open up your Bible and slowly read I Samuel 3: 1-10. I am sure if you are reading this you can't help but to notice that Eli is old and "the word of the Lord was rare in those days." I'm equally certain you have noticed God's rather intriguing call to Samuel. As in so many Bible stories, we are witnessing a power shift here. The torch is being passed from the priesthood of Eli to the prophetic ministry of Samuel.

All this got me wondering; has a torch been passed in the church? Is the word of the Lord rare – no longer as vivid as it once was – in the more traditional churches like ours? Is God choosing to speak through and do a new thing solely through the more contemporary church?

Before you allow anyone to declare the more traditional church no longer relevant or worse yet dead, please note that old Eli needs to tell young Samuel that this voice, which so intrudes and confuses the young man, is from God. Having had past experiences of God, we at least know how God sounds when God stirs. I do believe that the younger, newer churches need the tradition, the roots of the older churches.

But those of us in the older, more established churches need the vitality, vividness and spontaneity of the younger churches. We need to celebrate what God is doing in many of these churches. Even though the traditional church seems to have difficulty relating to and attracting the younger generation; thank God, God is not limited to us, not limited to our style of worship, our method of preaching, our way of being church.

Despite the countless stylistic issues that keep generations apart on Sunday mornings, I can't help but believe that this grieves the heart of God. Instead of focusing on the differences that have helped create the contemporary versus traditional mentality that permeates the landscape of the 21<sup>st</sup> century church; should we not focus on our oneness in Christ and the unity of the Spirit? Should we not worship, pray, grow and serve together?

Maybe we should even rethink the language we use to describe the church. There is not the contemporary church, the younger church. There is not the traditional church, the older church. There is only one church – the holy Christian church.

*Lord, help us to be one church; a church where young and old  
are welcomed, loved, affirmed  
and gather to hear God's word – a word that is anything but rare.*

This exciting, auditioned handbell ensemble from Chicagoland was featured on WTTW's "Artbeat Chicago". It enjoys an on-going collaboration with pianist/composer Joel Raney, and has performed with jazz trumpeter Orbert Davis, the Rockford Symphony, the North Shore Choral Society, the Illinois Brass Band, the Elgin Choral Union, the West Suburban Symphony, and the West Towns Chorus. The 15 musicians have a collective ringing experience of more than 390 years, and perform on 76 bronze Malmark handbells and 73 Malmark Choirchimes®.

Founder and director of The Agape Ringers, David L. Weck, is an editor at Hope Publishing in Carol Stream, IL, where he is solely responsible for creating and developing the company's handbell catalog. Weck serves as a guest conductor at handbell events all over the United States and Canada, as well as Puerto Rico and Japan.

The Agape Ringers is noted for beautifully orchestrated presentations of entertaining and varied music. Listeners are entranced by the ensemble's energy, precision and musicality. Since its founding in 1992, The Agape Ringers has made more than 270 appearances across North America, Puerto Rico, and England. The ringers have been featured as performers and teachers for events such as the Fellowship of American Baptist Musicians Conference for Church Musicians in Green Lake, WI, and local, regional and national gatherings of the Handbell Ringers of America. In the summer of 2012, the ensemble will embark on an 11-day Midwest tour, teaching and performing in St. Charles, MO, Omaha, NE, Overland Park, KS, and Duluth, MN.

## Voicing Your Choice

A few weeks ago, I took four students to Covenant Harbor. The theme at camp this winter was "Voice Your Choice." At the heart of this call is the question, how do we do that? When I worked at camps, I asked the hard questions or revealed the tough call of a Christian. The churches had to pick up and do the work of continually forming the students.

Now, I am on the church side again as a group of students comes back from camp, as happened this year, having just declared their choice to follow Jesus – and we have hard work ahead.

Camps tell our kids about Jesus and the students come back excited to follow through on this commitment and they look to us. Pastors, parents, other church members all come together to show how mature Christians voice their choice to follow Jesus. What message are we sending? How easily is church brushed off for sports, parties, sleep?

We often say in one moment that the choice for Jesus is the most important choice you can ever make and, in the next, consider Christian formation and *worship* a matter of convenience; we should not be surprised that church attendance among the younger generations is waning and Christian morality is replaced by a set of niceties that is indistinguishable from those who have not or never will make a choice for Jesus.

We are entering another round of elections and, as the candidate's promises are held against the scrutiny of their actions, we should be mindful that our actions are similarly judged by those around us. As candidates are now to rise and fall on the basis of promises made and actions taken, we too should be reminded of the critical need to voice your choice to follow Jesus.

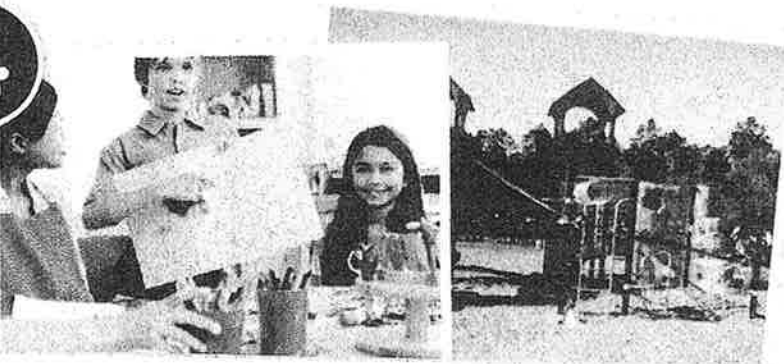
