Over the Pastor's Shoulder

In a time when many feel overwhelmed by change – the erosion of the middle class, high unemployment among young adults, soaring debt, the demise of once sound institutions, changing social mores, the information explosion – one wonders if the church would do well to play the role of island of stability amidst all this change. Not surprisingly some people caution, “steady as she goes”. After all, people are desperate for stability. Church is the last place people want to be faced with change.

However, it is incomprehensible that we call a stability-protecting, past-perpetuating institution “the Body of Christ”. Jesus is always on the move in the gospels. Never once did he say, “Settle down with me”. No, with vagabond Jesus it was always, “Follow me!”

Consider the first days of Christ’s resurrected life. Not content just to be raised from the dead, the risen Christ is in motion returning to the rag-tag group of Galilean losers who had failed him.

And what does Jesus say? “You have had a rough time. Settle down in Galilee among those good country folk with whom you are most comfortable. Buy real estate, build a church, get a good mortgage and enjoy being a spiritual club.” No. The risen Christ commands, “Get out of here! Make me disciples, baptizing and teaching everything I have commanded! And don’t limit yourselves to Judea, go to everybody. I’ll stick with you to the end of time – just be sure to obey me.”

How like the wandering Jesus to disallow his people rest. Refusing to permit them to hunker down with their own kind, he sent those who had so disappointed him forth on the most perilous of missions. They were, in Jesus’ name, to take back the world that belonged to God. There is no way to be with Jesus, to love Jesus, without obeying Jesus, venturing forth with Jesus. “Go! Make disciples!”

One way to tell if a person is in good health is if that person is out and about, if that person is able to be a person in motion.

One of the marks of a healthy church is that it is on the move, trying to keep up with the ever-moving Christ. Though Trinity has been on the corner of 93rd and Pulaski for 50+ years, the church has shown a wonderful willingness to be in motion with the risen Christ.

Fall marks the beginning of a new church year – with activities both new and old – don’t miss out on the opportunity to encounter Christ amidst the organized chaos, the hustle and bustle of our life together.

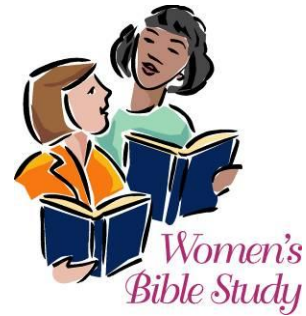
Sunday School Kickoff and Picnic

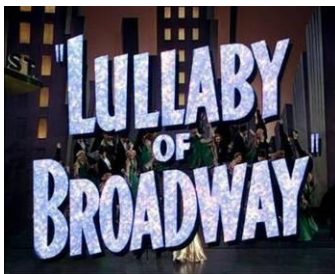
Noah's Ark Preschool

Covenant Women News

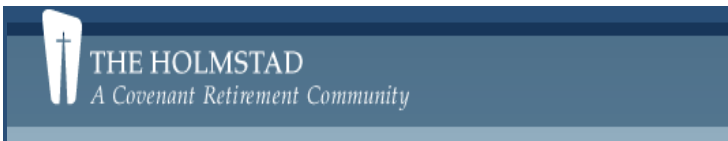

This is so simple. Of the thousands of questions people might have when they are going through a crisis, the one they all wanted but would never ask, "Will somebody please hold my hand?"

I share this story because it is the bedrock of how I understand ministry, and is one that I think we all can share. There is so much in life, so many terrifying difficulties that are too big for anyone to solve so we, I, sit and do nothing. Yet the constant lesson of the summer is this, the multiplying and terrifying questions of life need complex answers. However, even complicated answers are almost always answered by first holding their hand. That is the sort of pastor I want to be because that is the sort of Christian I believe we all should be.

Are You Interested???

Did you know that God used a woman named Tabitha (Dorcas) in the Bible to lead people to Jesus Christ? Tabitha also was called Dorcas. She worked sewing coats and clothing for the people. That was her special talent to help provide for others. **Acts 9:36-42**

Would you be interested in joining others in a time of fellowship and needlework? Can you knit or crochet? Do you cross stitch, do needlepoint or quilt? Or maybe you know how to do none of the above but have always wanted to learn? Well, here is your chance to learn something new or finish a project you started a long time ago. We will be looking for service projects down the line, but for now this will be for fellowship and fun.

Are you interested in some type of cooking group? Do you know how to cook? Maybe you have that special dinner that is your signature dish and you haven't had family around in some time to cook for. Would you like to lead a class in preparation of that dish sometime here at the church kitchen?

Or maybe you are the type that struggles just boiling water. This is your chance to learn how to cook in the kitchen and break the chains of fast food/carry-out bondage! Make this a mom/daughter outing or a father/son time! Or maybe adopt a grandchild from your church family and bring them with to learn how to prepare meals.

So why do we want to do this? Food is about much more than eating! It is around food that a great number of our most important moments occur and most significant memories are forged. Most of us associate life milestones and key celebrations with food. Eating and celebration and community seem to belong together.

Why is eating together with others such a powerful thing? There are a few reasons. Meals are built upon something we all have in common (we all need to eat!). In the sharing of food people are often drawn together in a way that transcends their differences. Eating well also requires us to stop. We then become present to others, so that not only food is shared but also time and space. Out of these "life pauses" there are opportunities for listening and speaking, sharing and caring, supporting and empathizing.

The Bible also affirms the value of gathering together around food. There are frequent references to meals, feasts and banquets in the stories of Scripture. Jesus did a great deal of his ministry around food. And for Christians the act of gathering weekly around bread and wine is a special means through which God gives his presence, power and grace.

And finally, what do you think about an exercise class? 1 Corinthians 6:19-20 says: "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body."

This would be an age-appropriate class working on stretching, balance and low-impact cardio (if applicable). No Jane Fonda workout just yet!
